Background

The Species Recovery Trust has become one of the largest training providers in the UK, providing a wide range of training for ecologist, conservationists, land managers and amateur naturalists.


Our courses are run by a range of the country's leading experts, and provide a platform for learning, as well as networking across organisations. We try and keep the experience as enjoyable as we can, while keeping focussed on every participant leaving each course with a deeper knowledge than when they arrived.

Our courses also raise the majority of funds to support our species recovery programme, allowing us to carry out longterm sustainably funded work on over 20 species across England, Wales and the Overseas Territories.

External Training

We ran over 50 courses per year in house, but are also called upon to provide external training for organisations on a range of different ecological subjects.

Due to high demand in 2022 we have had to streamline the way we run this. We hope this new system provides good value for external organisations, with a range of training on offer, as well as a chance to support our species conservation work in a meaningful way.



Training packages

Package 1 - Hybrid Training

Cost: **£1200**

Includes:

- One full-day field training at a venue of your selection (for 10-20 attendees)
- 5 online training courses at dates of your choosing/ or 50 places on our existing online course

For a company with 20 employees booking this many places directly would cost £4050

Package 2 - Online Winter Training

Cost: **£1000**

Includes:

- 5 online training courses at dates of your choosing with specific live Zoom Q&A afterwards

Package 3 - Single Field Course

Cost: **£700** + travel

Includes:

- One full-day field training at a venue of your selection (for 10-20 attendees)

The Species Recovery Trust is a charity set up to tackle the loss of some of the rarest species in the UK.

There are over nine hundred native species in the UK that are classed as under threat, with several hundreds more currently widespread but known to be in significant decline. The countryside is now bereft of many species that were a familiar sight a mere generation ago.

A small number of these species are on the absolute brink of existence, poised to become extinct in our lifetimes; our goal is to stop them vanishing.

Our aim is to remove 50 species from the edge of extinction in the UK by the year 2050. In addition we are reconnecting people with wildlife and the natural world through training programmes and awareness raising.
